

Camp Dance (Level I and Level II)

This year, we will be offering two levels of our camp dance, both at officer and line camp. This will allow dancers to choose the level that will best suit their personal skills. The description below should help directors and students choose wisely:



Level I Camp Dance

This dance will contain advanced elements and tricks that will allow the intermediate to advanced dancer to challenge and display their skills. For auditions on the last day of camp, those students choosing the Level I Camp Dance will be eligible for All American (high school) and AA Honorable Mention.

Level II Camp Dance

This dance will be the same basic choreography as Level I camp dance (to the same music) but will have modified tricks that will keep it as an intermediate level dance. It will allow the beginner to intermediate dancer a chance to feel success, yet be challenged with the basic elements. For auditions on the last day of camp, those students choosing the Level II Camp Dance will be eligible for AA Honorable Mention (high school) and Jr All American.

Kick Series (Jr and Sr Levels)

This year, we are offering a Jr Kick Series as well as a Sr Kick Series for those dancers wishing to participate in the Kick Off for Miss High Kick and Kick Company. Both versions of the kick series can be found on our "Miss High Kick Information" link on the camp page. It will include the notes, the video footage, and the music that can be downloaded and learned in advance of camp. For the kick off, we will place all 9th grade and under participants in groups of 10 (by height) for the first round, and the same groupings for 10th grade and over, also in groups of 10. Each participant will be issued a number to wear and staff will choose dancers from each round to move on to the next.

Jr Kick Series

This will be the same kick series we have used in the past. It will include all the very basic kick combinations and will be not too lengthy for the 9th grade and under students.

Sr Kick Series

This series will be longer than the Jr Kick series and include more technical kick combinations so that the staff/judges will have more time to analyze and judge each participant in the kick off.
